February 1, 2026 – 1320 hours

A welfare check was requested on Wood Acre Drive. One subject was transported to the hospital for further evaluation.

February 1, 2026 – 2042 hours

A resident reported a possible burglary on E. South Street. No forced entry was found and nothing was reported stolen, but the RP stated that several lights were left on and someone had used the bathroom. The investigation is ongoing.

February 2, 2026 – 1055 hours
