### Summary

The population of the United States is rapidly aging. By 2030, one of every five people in the United States will be 65 years of age or older and by 2035, the number of adults older than 65 will be greater than the number of children under 18. Baby Boomers, the second largest generation in history, are at or nearing retirement age. This number of adults at or over 65 will continue to grow increasingly faster over the next decade. With this substantial jump comes many challenges for communities. However, many opportunities arise as well.

Age-Friendly Bellbrook is a planning and implementation initiative designed to identify the needs of older adults and take steps necessary to create the most livable community for all. Age-Friendly Bellbrook will not only improve the quality of life for its current residents but also welcome new citizens to experience the "Small Town Friendly" nature of the community.

Managing these challenges for an Age-Friendly Bellbrook will require an "out-of-the-box" approach. Two examples of the challenges faced in Bellbrook are accessibility/walkability and aging in place. The aging residents of Bellbrook are very active and desire the ability to move about downtown swiftly and safely. Also, unsurprisingly, the vast majority of aging residents wish to stay in their home for as long as possible. The City of Bellbrook has begun setting the wheels in motion to address these challenges.

Improving the age-friendliness of our community is a major opportunity to improve the lives of our residents. While this project is primarily focused on aging adults, it is important to recognize this project will improve the quality of life for all ages.

# **Community Profile**

Total Population of Bellbrook	7,328
Population of Persons over 65	1,180 (16.1%)

The overall population of Bellbrook is approximately 7,328. The population of persons over the age of 65 is approximately 1,180 or 16.1 % of the total population. The number of people over the age of 65 is expected to increase very rapidly over the next decade. With this in mind, the necessity to plan and implement projects and programs to become more age-friendly has become evident. As stated earlier, the aging population of Bellbrook is very active, making walkability, parks, and the ability to age in place project priorities.



# **Report Summary**

#### The Core

Currently, one in six residents of Bellbrook are 65 years or older. This number is anticipated to grow rapidly over the next decade.

### The Action

The aging population will require our community to adapt. In 2020, Bellbrook was recognized by AARP for its commitment to developing comprehensive age-friendly policies. This project is referred to as Age-Friendly Bellbrook.

#### The Process

Age-Friendly Bellbrook is led by the Bellbrook City Council and City staff, partnered with AARP.

The aging population of Bellbrook was engaged through online and paper surveys, as well as focus groups. Public participation was open for two months. Two focus groups were held, facilitated by city staff. Unfortunately, attendance was less than expected for the focus groups. Staff reviewed the survey questions at the focus groups, but allowed the attendees to have honest discussions about the wants and needs of the aging community.

### **Key Findings**

Housing and activities are the most prominent issues within Bellbrook.

- 1. Housing Concerns
  - A shortage of affordable housing options for lower- and middle-income older adults exists.
  - The ability to age in place was overwhelmingly important.

### Report Summary Cont.

- 91% of older adults stated it was very important to remain in Bellbrook.
- In correlation, the same 91% of older adults felt it was very important to be able to age within the home.

### 2. Walkability

- 60% of older adults stated sidewalks can be uneven and unsafe.
- 50% stated they had limited sidewalks within their neighborhood.
- 54% stated streets and walks needed to be more well-lit.

### 3. Programming/Entertainment

- 63% of responses stated they would like more access to programs and activities geared toward older adults.
- 72% stated they wanted access to a variety of activities.
- 81% stated they wanted more fitness-related activities.



# **Age-Friendly Bellbrook**

#### Introduction

One in six residents of Bellbrook are age 65 or older. As the population continues to age, and people remain healthy and active longer, Bellbrook has to adapt. Wellplanned, livable communities promote health and economic growth. An age-friendly Bellbrook makes for happier and healthier residents of all ages.

### Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What is the Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities?

The Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities is a collection of over 300 towns, cities, counties, and states in the United States that have made the commitment to become age-friendly. Membership in the network does not mean that a community is age-friendly, but rather the community's elected leadership has made a commitment to actively work toward making their community a great place for people of all ages.

In 2020, Bellbrook became a member of the Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities.

### 2. What does Age-Friendly Bellbrook involve?

Age-Friendly Bellbrook is a community driven effort. Thanks to input from the community and City Council, several projects are fully planned or in the planning process for advancements in age-friendly improvements and activities.

### The Plan: The Eight Domains

The World Health Organization and AARP have identified eight domains to focus on when evaluating the agefriendliness of a community. All survey questions were developed around these domains.

### 1. Outdoor Spaces and Buildings

People need public places to gather, indoors and out. Green spaces, seating and accessible buildings can be used and enjoyed by people of all ages. Outdoor spaces are a focus of Age-Friendly Bellbrook.

### 2. Transportation

Driving shouldn't be the only way to get around. Pedestrians require sidewalks and crossable streets. Public transit options can range from large to small scale. Bike lanes benefit all modes of transportation. Age-Friendly Bellbrook will focus on safer pedestrian modes of transportation.

### 3. Housing

AARP surveys consistently find that the vast majority of older adults want to reside in their current home or community for as long possible. Doing so is possible if a home is designed or modified for aging in place, or a community has housing options that are suitable for different incomes, and stages of life. Age-Friendly has taken action regarding housing. Code changes have been proposed for Accessory Dwelling Units, ADU's and other accessibility issues.

### 4. Social Participation

Various activities and groups are available through the Bellbrook Senior Center and Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Park District.

### 5. Respect and Social Inclusion

Everyone wants to feel valued. Multigenerational activities are a great way for young and older people to learn from one another.

# The Plan: The Eight Domains cont.

### 6. Work and Civic Participation

An age-friendly community encourages older adults to be actively engaged in community life and has opportunities for residents to work or volunteer.

### 7. Communication and Information

Communication and information is easily accessible for all ages. The City has various ways of distributing information and public announcements. Bellbrook has accessibility to public computers at the Winters Library.

### 8. Community and Health Services

A wide range of health care facilities are available throughout the community, including a hospital. Residents also have access to healthcare education opportunities.

### **Process and Public Engagement**

#### **Introduction**

This findings report relied on public engagement through the use of a survey, both on-line and paper and two focus groups. More than 100 Bellbrook residents participated in the survey and focus groups.

Survey Participants: 93

Focus Group Attendees: 8

### **Timeline**

The City of Bellbrook began its journey to becoming an age-friendly community in 2020 when it officially became a member. The timeline for this journey is:

2023 – Assessment

Existing needs and data compiled from the surveys are put into the findings report.

2023 – Planning

Based on the findings of the surveys, priority projects are developed. Considering current funding and abilities, those priority projects are further prioritized. These fall into an action plan spanning two years.

2024-2025 – Implementation

Stakeholders execute the projects on the action plan. Changes will be made to the action plan periodically.

2025 - Evaluation

Progress and projects are evaluated.

# **Outdoor Spaces and Buildings**

#### Introduction

The aging population require a high standard of accessible design, particularly the design of sidewalks, crosswalks, building entrances, restrooms, and parks. These advanced designs create a safer and more enjoyable environment for all ages.

### **Issues**

### 1. Walkability


60% of survey respondents stated Bellbrook has uneven or unsafe sidewalks. This issue holds true in Bellbrook's downtown and in several residential neighborhoods. Some sidewalks downtown are quite narrow and directly adjacent to the street. Also, all of the residential neighborhoods constructed prior to 1970 were built without sidewalks, making the walkability of the neighborhoods difficult.

In order to be compliant with ADA requirements, some sidewalks must be widened, and ramps and tread mats must be added. The City has taken steps to address these issues in a Downtown Revitalization Project scheduled to begin in the summer of 2023.

#### 2. Public Restrooms

30% of respondents stated Bellbrook did not have access to public restrooms. This is an issue that will require significant planning to address.

# **Transportation**



### **Introduction**

Transportation is on the most pressing issues facing most communities' aging populations. As residents age and surrender the ability to drive, the reliance of other forms of transportation becomes necessary. However, residents of Bellbrook overwhelmingly buck this trend.

77% of survey responses stated, "I drive myself", while only 7% of respondents used some sort of public transportation.

This speaks to the overall independence of the aging population of Bellbrook.

### Housing

### **Introduction**

The aging population want to remain in their home as long as possible. Older adults in Bellbrook are not different. 90% of surveys stated it was very important to be able to remain in their home. The community and their home are a source of comfort and stability. However, aging in place can be a challenge. Some residents may be forced to leave their home due to inaccessibility, financial hardships, or the need for assisted care. A wide range of housing options is a necessity for a strong, age-friendly community.

### <u>Issues</u>

#### 1. Assisted Care

Bellbrook does not have an assisted care or nursing facility. The lack of this type of facility can force long-time Bellbrook residents to leave the community. From a development perspective, this is a top priority of recruitment.

#### 2. Affordable Independent Living


The average price of a single-family home in Bellbrook is \$387,000, up 64.7% from 2022. As older adults move toward retirement and a more fixed income, this can be a huge challenge. Much like assisted care, affordable single-family and multi-family housing options are a top priority for recruitment.



# Social and Civic Participation

### Social Participation

55% of older adults in Bellbrook stated they participate in social or community activities only a few times per year or less. This lack of participation or opportunity to participate can lead to feelings of isolation, loneliness, and other mental health issues.




To help ease the feelings of isolation, Age-Friendly Bellbrook will work toward partnerships with the Bellbrook Senior Center and Bellbrook Resource Center to bring more older adults together. Programming is also being planned to connect older adults with young members of the community in a mentoring style engagement.

# Social and Civic Participation

### Civic Participation


More older adults are working longer and postponing retirement. 37% of responses stated they are employed. Most of those same respondents stated they are working because they are able and want to, not out of necessity. 63% of respondents stated they are retired and are not looking to go back into the workforce. For the respondents that are seeking new employment opportunities, 40% stated the available opportunities did not match their skillset, and 40% stated they have not been hired because of their age.



### Community and Health Services

### **Introduction**

Fortunately for older residents of Bellbrook, health services are readily available throughout the community. Almost 72% of respondents stated they had access to the medical services they needed. More than 50% stated they had access to the home care they needed. Also, 81% of respondents stated they had access to vision and dental care.






## In the past year, could you pay for your medical bills?




In the past year, could you pay for your prescriptions?








